It contains a permanent exhibition centred on Newman's life, and the people and places associated with him. There is also a fine collection of Newman memorabilia.

Appeal for Newman's College at Littlemore



The influence of John Henry Newman, one of the outstanding voices of 19th-century Roman Catholicism, has spread throughout the Christian world and is stronger than ever today. He lived and prayed for four years at The College in Littlemore where he was received into the Catholic Church on 9th October 1845.

The College is administered by The Spiritual Family The Work which was founded by Mother Julia Verhaeghe (1910—1997) and was given papal approval as a *Family of Consecrated Life* in 2001.

In 1987, the Birmingham Oratory Fathers invited the Sisters of The Work to become custodians of The College, which is a centre of prayer, pastoral service and ecumenical outreach. Visitors from every corner of the world and from many different Christian denominations come to Newman's College. The Society of The Work is established as a registered charity in England and Wales.
